Starting with ten films, the plans for 2025 are to screen up to 100 and eventually evolve toward screening 1000 films related to Field Sciences, Conservation and Sustainability every year at the beginning of the winter season - during the weekend when the slopes open to the public. The main fundraiser for the festival is the "Exploration Train" venue.

On 22 February 2019, Mackay piloted VSS Unity VF-01 above the 50-mile FAA-recognized boundary of space.
